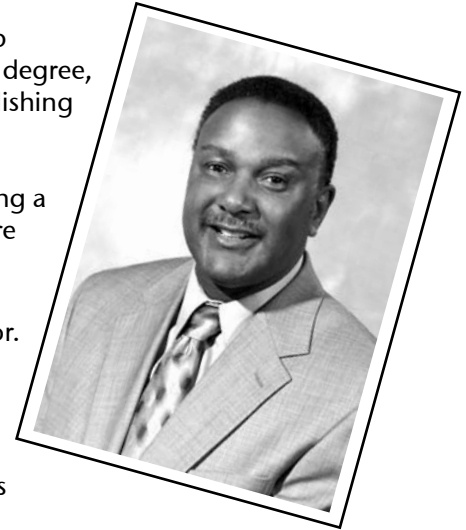
# Welcome to Modesto Junior College

## Definitions

<b>ARR. (ARRANGED):</b>	Additional class time that is arranged with the instructor.
<b>CAMPUS:</b>	Indicates the campus or general location of the course, i.e. WEST Campus, EAST Campus, or OFF CAMPUS, etc.
<b>CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT:</b>	You may only take this course while you are taking another specified course.
<b>HYBRID:</b>	Class will be held both online and in a traditional classroom setting. See page 150 for detailed information about hybrid courses.
<b>MATERIAL FEE:</b>	An additional fee for course specific materials that will be provided by the college.
<b>INSTRUCTOR:</b>	The name of the full or part-time faculty who will instruct this section.
<b>LEARNING COMMUNITY (LC):</b>	A pair or cluster of courses that you must enroll in.
<b>ONLINE:</b>	Offered on the internet, and has specific equipment requirements for students who take it. See pages 149-150 for detailed information about online courses.
<b>PREREQUISITE:</b>	A course or requirement which MUST be completed prior to your enrollment in the selected course.
<b>PLUS/AND:</b>	An additional class time (usually a lab or otherwise) that is REQUIRED for the selected course.
<b>RECOMMENDED FOR SUCCESS:</b>	A course that will help you succeed by teaching skills and content matter.
<b>ROOM:</b>	The building & room or location of the class on the specified "campus".
<b>SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION:</b>	SI Leader(s) will attend class with you and lead group study in many of the difficult math and science classes. See page 176 for detailed information about Supplemental Instruction.
<b>SYNONYM/SECTION #:</b>	A four-digit course number that uniquely identifies a particular "section" of any given course from any other course section at MJC.
<b>STAFF:</b>	A placeholder indicating that the instructor has not yet been selected for the section.

## Understanding MJC's Course Numbers

### 1-49 "College Prep/ Developmental"

Prepares students for college-level curriculum. Does not apply toward an Associate degree, nor do they transfer to other community colleges or four-year universities.

### 50-99 "Associate degree"

Valid toward an Associate degree, but they will not transfer to a university.

### 100-299 "Transferable"

Will count toward an Associate degree and are designed for transferability to a four-year university.

### 300-399 "Vocational"

Applies to certification or licensure. May apply toward Associate degree and credit may be given by a receiving institution **after** you have transferred to a four-year university.

## Auditing

Students who have exceeded the maximum repeat allowance for a course are permitted to audit the course, if there are seats available. Students interested in auditing must complete the Credit Course Audit Form available in the MJC Admissions Office. If approved, there is a non-refundable auditing fee of \$15/unit. Students enrolled in 10 or more units at the time enrollment occurs will not be assessed the \$15/unit fee for up to 3 units. All other associated fees will be assessed.

Those auditing credit courses will receive no credit for class work and no grade. Auditors will, however, be required to complete activities assigned by the instructor. Enrollment is subject to space availability. Registered students who are taking the class for college credit take precedence over auditors.

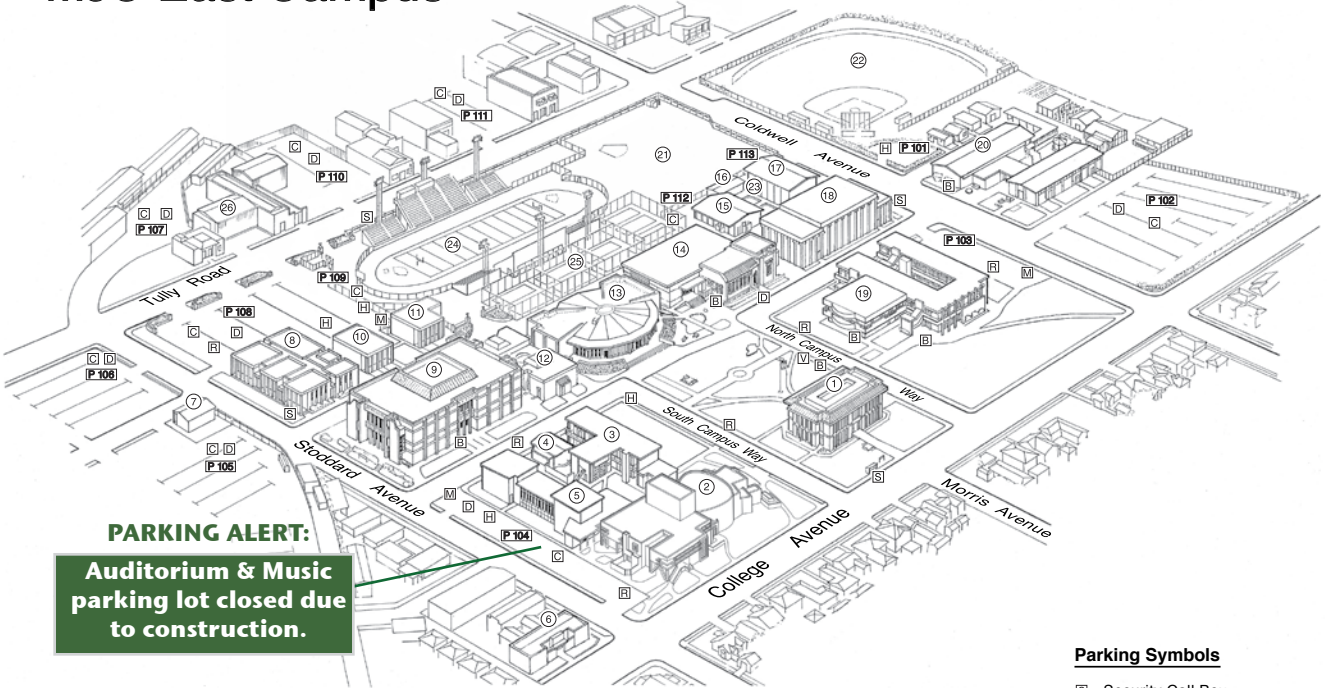

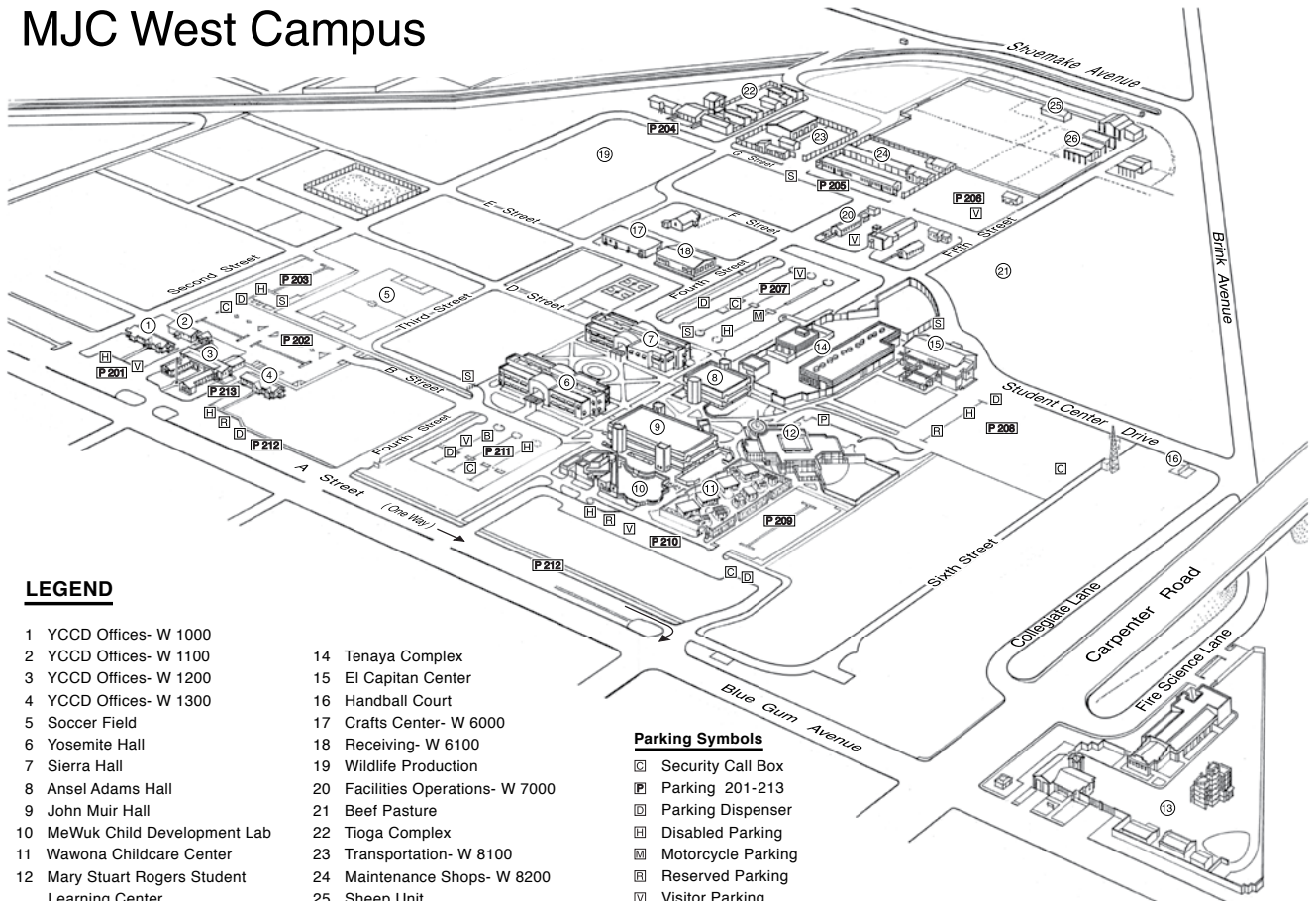
