Each week we received a short message with interesting information about the College, our community, and the environment of higher education. With a grateful nod to his example, we are reviving the Monday “Just the Facts” email with a few facts and a definition or two each week. They will be brief and (hopefully) interesting.

MJC Just the Facts 2017

Did you know that MJC recently published the 2017 edition of its FactBook?

Here are a few interesting things you can find there:

- In 2015-16, there were 24,149 students enrolled at some point during the entire academic year (unduplicated headcount).
- There were 17,707 enrolled students in the fall 2016 semester (unduplicated headcount).
- In fall 2016, 33% of enrolled students were full-time students.
- One in five students was a first-time student in 2015-16.
- In 2015-16, 65% of the student population was from historically underrepresented racial/ethnic groups such as African-Americans, Asians, Hispanics, and Pacific Islanders

Definitions:

- **Unduplicated headcount:** actual number of individual students enrolled. Each student is only counted once, regardless of the number of courses being taken.
