

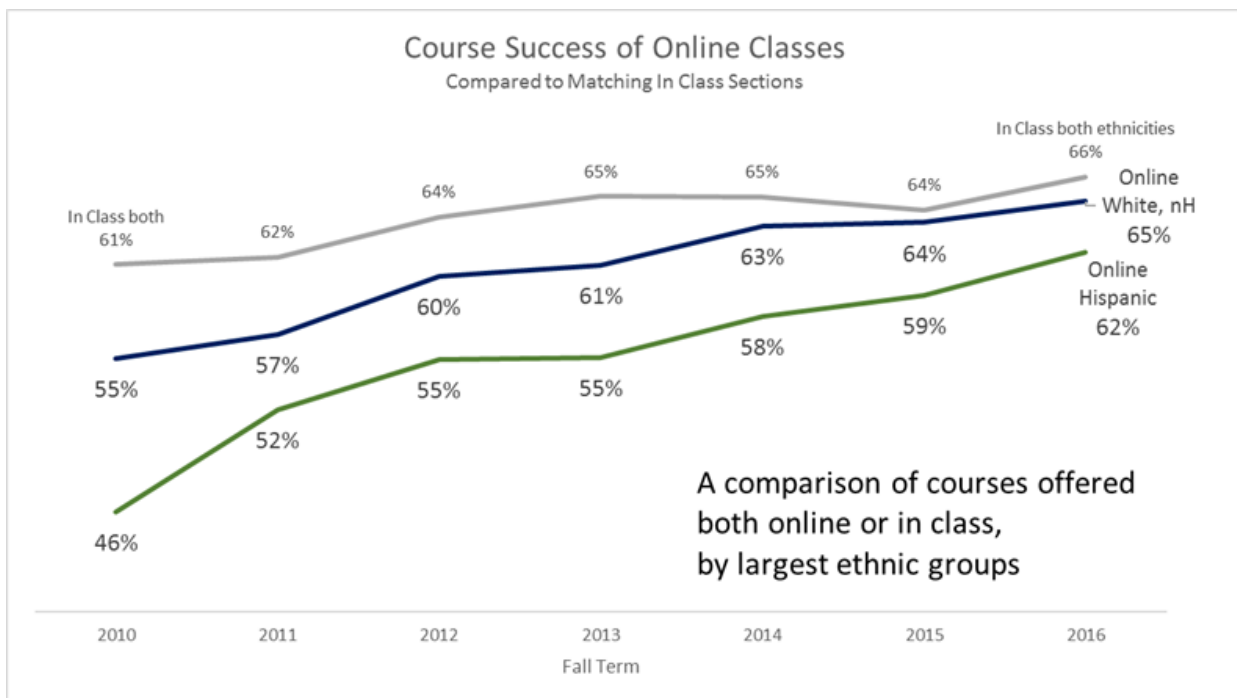

MJC Just the Facts 2017

A comparison of Online Courses to their In Class sections over 6 years:

- Hispanic success gap has dropped to just 3% difference from White, non-Hispanic students
- The difference between online and face to face courses has nearly been eliminated (4% Hispanics, 1% White, nH)
- Enrollment in Online classes has swelled for Hispanic students as well, increasing from ~1600 to ~4700 seats in Fall 16

The table below illustrates the changes in Online (including hybrid) course success over the past 7 Fall terms. While enrollment has increased in online classes (not shown), the difference between Online and In Class has diminished to within a few percentage points.
