RESOLUTION FL02-E: SENATE REPRESENTATION ON COLLEGE COUNCIL
September 26, 2002**

WHEREAS, our new College President has voiced his opinion that College Council would be a more representative body if there were more equal representation of the constituent groups on the Council.

WHEREAS, both classified and student representatives have voiced their support of this position.

WHEREAS, the origin of the three Senators and two YFA members to the College Council arose out an agreement a few years ago to offset the fact that YFA was to have two representatives on District Council to one for the Senate. This uneven arrangement at District Council was ended a few years ago.

WHEREAS, even with this proposed reduction, the MJC Faculty will retain four seats on the College Council which exceeds all other constituencies (three administrative, two Classified, and two students) The Faculty Consultant to the Board also attends College Council as a non-member.

THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Academic Senate, in a spirit of shared governance, voluntarily agrees to reduce its representation on the College Council from three to two seats, eliminating the ex-officio Senate Secretary seat on College Council.
