TEACHING TO THE COUSE OUTLINE

Proposed by: Academic Senate Executive Committee

WHEREAS, The Model District Policy developed by the State Chancellor's Matriculation Regulations Review Task Force of 1993 states that:

"Each college shall establish a procedure so that course for which prerequisites or corequisites are established will be taught in accordance with the course outline, particularly those aspects of the course outline that are the basis for justifying the establishment of the prerequisites or corequisite.", and

WHEREAS, on July 26, 1994, the YCCD approved the Policy No. 5033 on course prerequisites. This policy states:

"The Yosemite Community College District required that the establishing, reviewing and challenging of prerequisites, corequisites, advisories on recommended preparation, and certain limitations on enrollment be done in a manner consistent with law and good practice. The district recognizes that these prerequisites, corequisites, advisories and limitations must be established carefully to ensure they do not become obstacles to student access. The District also recognizes that it is important to have prerequisites where they are a vital factor in maintaining academic standards and student success. Procedures are to be established which reflect these principles", and

WHEREAS, the Staff handbook Section 430.000 concerns Instruction. The Instructional administrator is responsible for assuring that these college procedures are criteria that are included in the evaluation of faculty. (See attachment of Staff Handbook)

THEREFORE, be it resolved that this new procedure be added to the Staff Handbook as Section 430-025 TEACHING OT THE COURSE OUTLINE, and state:

"All instructors agree to teach at a minimum the material as specified in the course outline of record."
