RESOLUTION SP93-Q: ACADEMIC INTEGRITY  
APRIL 22, 1993

PROPOSED BY: ACADEMIC INTEGRITY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS: Academic cheating is a problem of concern to many faculty it is recommended that Academic Integrity Definitions be published along with the Student Code of Conduct in both the MJC catalog and course schedule.

Further, we encourage faculty to include this information on course information sheets handed out to students at the beginning of classes and to include an explanation of what these terms and academic dishonesty mean within the content of each course taught.

We recommend that each Division at MJC discuss academic integrity and decide if more specific codes of penalties are necessary within disciplines.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

That the following Academic Integrity Definitions be adopted:

CHEATING: Intentionally using or attempting to use unauthorized materials, information, or study aids in any academic exercise. The term academic exercise includes all forms of work submitted for credit or hours. Misrepresenting or non-reporting of pertinent information.

FACILITATING ACADEMIC DISHONESTY: Intentionally or knowingly helping, or attempting to help another, to violate a provision of the institutional code of academic integrity.

PLAGIARISM: The deliberate adoption or reproduction of ideas, words, or statements of another person as one's own without acknowledgment, e.g., everything you write down on paper must be your own answer or content explained in your own words. This includes all group work and written assignments.
