Policy

7330 Communicable Disease

All newly hired academic employees shall have on file a medical certificate indicating freedom from **communicable diseases including** tuberculosis. No academic employee shall commence service until such medical certificate has been provided to the District.

All newly hired employees must show that they have been examined ~~within the past~~ **not more than** 60 days **prior to employment** to determine that they are free from active tuberculosis.

All employees shall be required to undergo an examination within four years of employment and every four years thereafter, to determine if they are free from tuberculosis.

Administrative Procedure

7330 Communicable Disease

For applicants for positions:

- A. A medical certificate is required showing that the applicant is free from any communicable disease, including, but not limited to, active tuberculosis, ~~not allowing~~ **unfitting** the applicant to instruct or associate with students.
- B. The medical certificate **completed** shall be submitted by a **health care provider** physician **shall be accepted** as authorized by code.
- C. The medical examination is conducted not more than **60 days** ~~six months~~ before the submission of the certificate and is at the expense of the applicant.
- D. A contract of employment may be offered to an applicant subject to the submission of the required medical certificate.
- E. The medical certificate becomes a part of the personnel record of the employee and is open to the employee or his or her designee.
- F. ~~Ongoing tuberculosis tests will be conducted every four years.~~
