Policy

7330 Communicable Disease

All newly hired employees shall have on file a medical certificate indicating freedom from **specified** communicable diseases, including tuberculosis. No employee shall commence service until such medical certificate has been provided to the District.

All newly hired employees must show that they have been examined **within the past not more than 60** days prior ~~to employment~~ to determine that they are free from active tuberculosis **by providing the District with a certificate from the employee’s examining physician showing that the employee was examined and found to be free from active tuberculosis.**

All employees shall be required to undergo an examination within four years of employment and every four years thereafter, to determine if they are free from tuberculosis.

Administrative Procedure

7330 Communicable Disease

For successful applicants for academic positions:

- A medical certificate is required showing that the applicant newly hired employee is currently free from any communicable disease, including, but not limited to, active tuberculosis, unfitting the newly hired applicant to instruct or associate with students.
- The medical certificate shall be submitted completed by a physician as authorized by code health care provider shall be accepted.
- The medical examination is conducted not more than 60 days before the submission of the certificate and is at the expense of the applicant.
- A contract of employment may be offered to an applicant subject to the submission of the required medical certificate.
- The medical certificate becomes a part of the personnel record of the employee and is open to the employee or his or her designee.

~~Ongoing tuberculosis tests will be conducted every four years.~~
