(SR) Recording Arts

Effective: Summer 2010

At the 11/03/09 meeting, the CCC-501 application and program requirements for a new (C) in Recording Arts were approved by the curriculum committee. However, on closer review of the application, it was discovered that the application was incomplete and not ready for forwarding to the Central Region Consortium, YCCD Board of Trustees, and the CCCC for approval. Consultation with the dean made it clear that the faculty author only intended for the curriculum committee to approve the award locally as a Skills Recognition as a preliminary step toward building a CCC-501. It was agreed that the faculty author would resubmit the proposal and application for Certificate of Achievement when the information was complete and prepared for review by external agencies.

IV. CONSENT

The chemistry department has some concerns about the validity of the statistics provided by the research department that were used to determine the CHEM 143 prerequisite. The department is in the process of re-evaluating those statistics and would like to incorporate a few more semesters of information to determine if this prerequisite is sound.

They are requesting that the MATH 90 prerequisite for CHEM 143 be postponed for 1 year and changed to an advisory for the 2010-2011 catalog. This would give the department sufficient time to look at the statistics and also allow a slower transition for the students.

Thank you for submitting the revised documents on October 22, 2009. Unfortunately, you have not submitted adequate documentation to reverse the denial of this application, of which you were notified on August 24, 2009. The application is still denied.

The new application lists the title as Fire Academy / Basic & Advanced, and notes 17 required units. The catalog language states Fire Academy with "complete 15 units" even though the total units for the two courses are 17. In the narrative, Criteria A.3 lists three courses that total only 7-12 units, which are below the minimum number of 12 units for an approved Certificate of Achievement.

The application states 55 Projected Annual Completers, but the narrative for Criteria B.6 does not support this number. Actually, Enrollment and Completer Projections are B.5 on the application. You have not addressed B.6 Place of Program in Curriculum.

I invite you to review the instructions in the Program and Course Approval Handbook, 3rd Edition, and re-submit a complete, new application when you are able to provide the complete requirements. You may continue to offer this certificate without Chancellor's Office approval, but it may not be listed on student transcripts.
