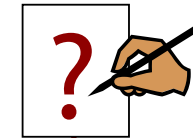

### Other Agreements

#### Course to Course

Faculty should work with MJC Articulation Officer to establish communication with the appropriate faculty from the receiving institution(s) to create an agreement.

#### Major Prep

Work with MJC Articulation Officer to establish communication with the appropriate faculty from the receiving institution(s) to create an agreement.

#### C-ID

Faculty should refer to [www.c-id.net](http://www.c-id.net). No curriculum committee approval is required. Assistance from Articulation Officer is available.

### Transfer to CSU

CSU assumes that MJC has developed and approved the course based on CSU EO 167 (ongoing).

### Transfer to UC

MJC courses proposed for UC Transfer are reviewed by UCOP (June) with the assumption that MJC has followed UC TCA Guidelines.

### CSU-GE

MJC Curriculum Committee approves/submits courses through Articulation Officer, then CSU Office of the Chancellor reviews submissions (Dec) with the assumption that the course has been developed in tandem with CU-EOs 1100 and 405.

### IGETC

MJC Curriculum Committee approves/submits courses through Articulation Officer, then UC/CSU Review Committee reviews submissions (Dec) with the assumption that course has been developed under IGETC - Standards, Policies, Procedures Version 1.6.

### MJC-GE

MJC Curriculum Committee approves courses under Title 5, Section 55063.
