Dear MJC Campus Facilities Board,

The Veterans Commemoration Structure is intended to honor the sacrifice and commitment MJC Veteran students have dedicated to military service but also embody the enduring commitment to success that they pledge as students seeking a fulfilling life.

The 9/11 Ground Zero Memorial (New York) artist Mr. Douwe Blumberg has committed to assisting the MJC veterans team in developing this remarkable piece, pending approval. No concrete solicitations have been conducted; only verbal conversations and images regarding the concept have been exchanged.

The design of the sculpture represents veteran students, past present and future, that have given their lives in service to this country but also represents the will to succeed and pursue excellence as students. The ascension of an eagle offers students, family members and staff/faculty a touch point that is not overtly military in nature and is dually symbolic; a message that resonates with both military members and all student demographics.

Materials: The base of the structure will be made of custom concrete and the eagle will be cast in an aircraft aluminum/magnesium alloy. The base of the eagle will be made from fabricated aluminum channel and sheet. No heating/cooling or plumbing considerations are involved.

Dimensions: The structure should stand just over 10 feet tall. The concrete pad will be a simple, in-ground square or circle of approximately 8 feet in diameter. A central raised section approximately 14 inches tall will help raise the sculpture marginally higher and create a subconscious "approach barrier."

Time line: Spring to summer 2016 (project design and image conception) / Fall 2016 (coordination & concept approval) / Spring 2016 March - (Concrete team assembles and prepares pad) / April 2017 - structure delivered and assembled / May 2017 Structure unveiling

Location: Entryway to Student Services Building, eastern grass planter lot.

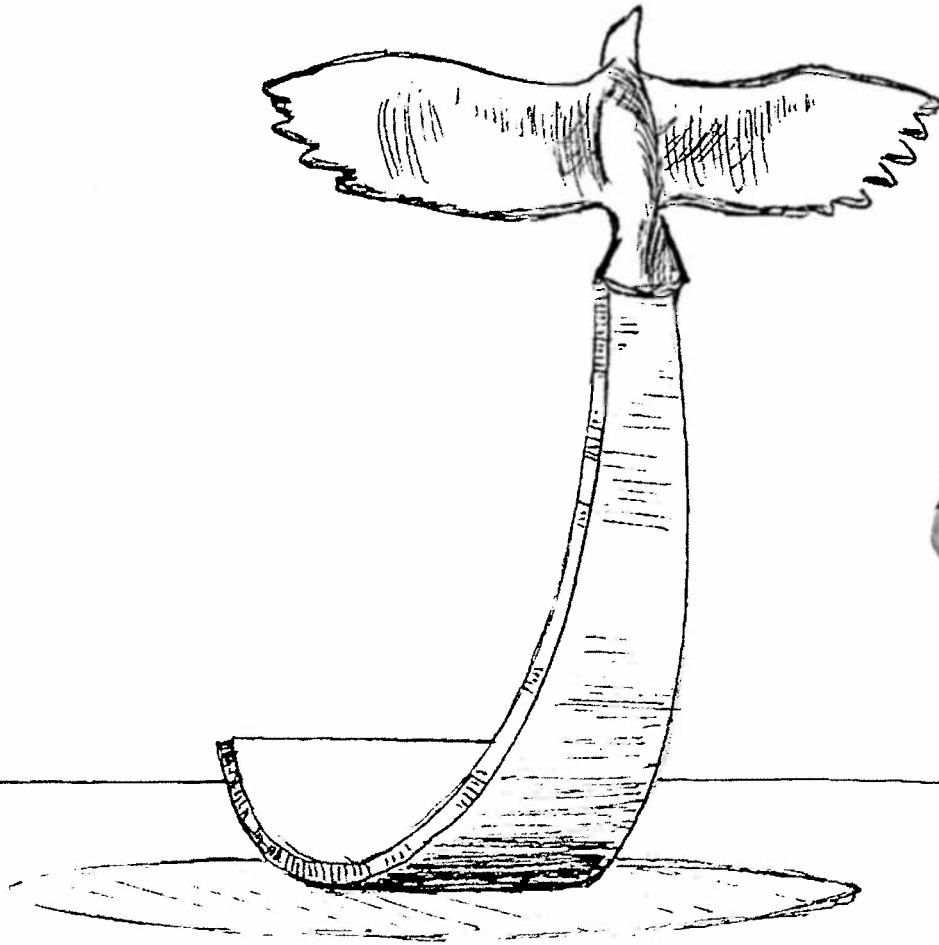


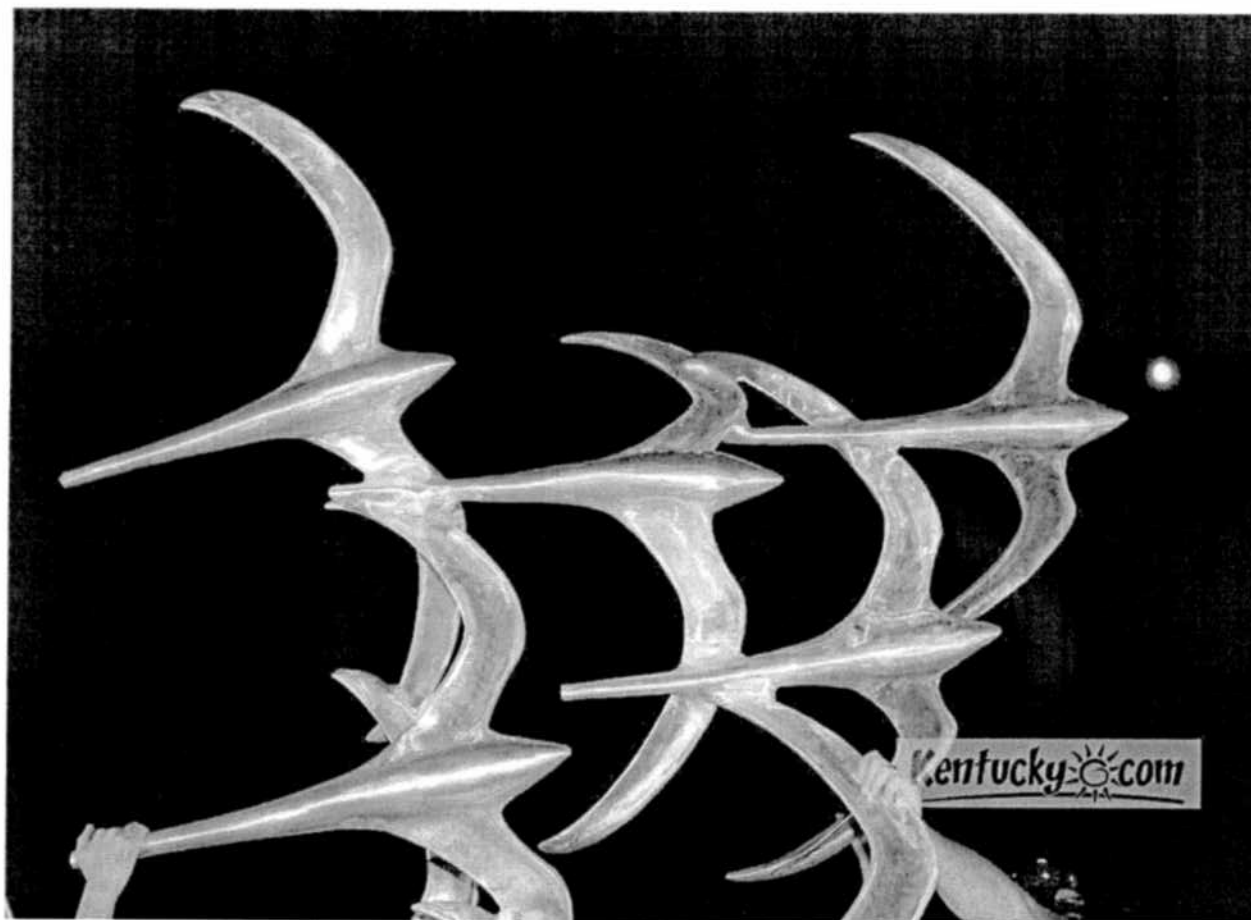
