I. Call to order

II. Approval of the agenda

III. Approval of the minutes of January 30, 2017

IV. Information and Action Items

A. UMOJA

The possibility of offering UMOJA and Puente programs on campus was discussed. Cost, scalability, and expected outcomes need to be determined, as well as approval from the various constituency groups. A workgroup is meeting this Thursday at 4:00 pm to discuss. Interested committee members were invited to attend.

B. MJC Educational Master Plan

The [Educational Master Plan](#) is available for review on the Accreditation webpage. A logic model is also available, mapping priorities and objectives. Members were invited to review the plan and send feedback to Jenni Abbott.

C. Evaluation of SSEC's work F16

Not ready for self-evaluation at this time. Will revisit at a future date.

D. Focus Groups

Several focus groups were conducted last March with the emphasis on men of color enrolled in English 49/50. It was a first attempt to see how students perceive the college and what challenges they may experience. A handout listing the challenges was distributed (attached) and committee members broke into groups of four to five to discuss and offer solutions to one of the four challenges. The compiled data will be available at the next meeting and later presented to College Council.

V. Other

A. Bus Transportation

Discussions are underway with city and county transportation managers to offer free bus service to students. An agreement has been reached with the city; a discussion with the county is forthcoming. Implementation goal is summer 2017.

B. Social Justice (SB1391)

The State prison system in Tracy and Stockton has made contact with VPSS Todd regarding adult high school programs. A couple of classes may be offered in the future. The subject matter has not been discussed, but may consist of general education, basic skills, and vocational courses. Stackable certificates may also be offered to those incarcerated short-term. J. Todd will forward information on the new county initiative to committee members.

C. A2MEND

Thirty students and eleven faculty/administrators will be attending the tenth annual conference in March. A few female students will also be in attendance. The conference will offer workshops, networking, a college fair, and a scholarship and awards dinner.
