III. Business/Discussion

- Eva Munguia: Eva shared the responsibilities of the Pathway Centers and their locations on both campuses. She also shared the support of undocumented students and has all the resources on their website: <http://www.mjc.edu/student-services/undocumented/dacarenewal.php>
 There will also be training for all staff that are interested. There will be a forum that will include attorneys (panel) which will be open to the public and co-sponsored by El Concilio, who will provide training information on workshops for peer/mentors. Ariana Gonzalez is spearheading this event. On October 7, *Sabado de Educacion* that will provide information to parents of high schools students. This presentation/event will be given totally in Spanish.
- Jackie Forté – College and Career Pathway partnership (AB 288) is well on its way. Spring is the target date for launching this project. Copy of AB 288 will be posted on the Student Services Council website.
 All high school counselor day is October 6 and as of 9.22.17, there have been 139 RSVPs, which is the highest in years past.

Two new student days are scheduled, one on April 14, 2018 and June 14, 2018. The SCOE, CSU, and UC partnership is targeted to launch in fall 2017. Jackie's team is working on the redesign of a brochure that describes the experience of students by including all services available to them. Core Step event is being coordinated and is being held here at MJC on

November 4 and December 2, 2017.

- Jenni Abbott - EMP* was passed last spring. There are 15 different workgroups to work together and put forward recommendations to college council. Council shared the different workgroups. Each group has an administrator and faculty and other members are classified and students. Jenni highlighted information literacy and technology task force. What students need to know when they receive a degree from MJC? Several pathway groups, three prongs, realigning curriculum and realigning student advising. Instructional faculty are involved in this project. Third prong is redesigning developmental education so that it does not take six years to finish basic skills, so what do students need to do to reach their educational goals. There is also marketing and website workgroups that will focus on students, community, and staff. MJC is six in the nation.
- Amy Yribarren – Amy updated the Council on the Food Pantry project she and her team have been working on and described the partnerships that she has created with the Lutheran Church across from MJC and United Samaritans. The Stanislaus County of Human Services will also provide a staff person (CalFresh). The pantry will be open Mondays at the church from 1-4 and at MJC. The Health Services Team is also working on the upcoming Fall health faire and this event will focus on nutrition.
- Accreditation - The team is coming October 2-5, 14 members and will be housed in the CAT building. They may possibly want to talk with members of the council. The team has already shared that there is plenty of evidence and we are all to be accommodating to the students.
