A. Michael Smedshammer, Distance Education

The Distance Education Committee needs feedback on 3 products that are currently being paid for: Respondus Lockdown (\$4,500), Turnitin.com (\$35,000), and Voice Thread (\$4,000).

Mike indicated that the competitors for Turnitin.com are outrageous and the program that was chosen to be eliminated was Respondus Lockdown.

Respondus Lockdown is very familiar to faculty and they're requesting to bring it back. Mike S. is hoping to find funding for it to avoid frustration and be able to start the new academic year with no uncertainty. Mike S. relayed that it would be even more ideal to have the program back by late spring/summer.

A meeting with Mike S. and Al Alt will be scheduled to discuss allocating a budget for this program.

B. Joshua Sigman, Front End Web Developer
