STARTING SUCCESSFULLY

What is a unit? A unit refers to the number of hours a college class meets each week. (In High School, this is called “credits.”) The average college course is worth 3 units, which means it meets for 3 hours each week.

How many units should I take? Special part-time students can only enroll in courses approved by their school principal or designee and must obtain parent or guardian permission. Students cannot enroll in more than 11 units.

Will I need to submit another application? Yes, as a high school student you submitted a 9-12 Dual Enrollment Application, which requires the Special Part-Time Petition for Advanced Admission form each semester. You will need to submit another application, as a High School graduate when you plan to start after high school graduation.

How do I know what courses are right for my goals? MJC offers a variety of majors, a number of different degrees, and three different General Education patterns. The right one for you will depend on your educational and career goals and these are different for every student. High School students are encouraged to take general education courses. Math and English classes should be taken after you have completed your entire high school curriculum.
