Meeting Minutes

State Budget “May Revise”: A. Pollard went over the AB86 Webinar slide show. Two central messages to the review were (1) the budget allocation board concept has been eliminated as a requirement and (2) the consortium will need decide on a set of procedures regarding how it will make decisions regarding programming and funding.

Action Item [P. Mendez, I. Rumayor, A. Pollard, and K. Williams]: Will meet June 8, 2015 to prepare a rough outline of rules and procedures to be discussed and finalized in July 2015 by the consortium.

A. Pollard discussed the Adult Education Block Grant Program.

Adult Education Expenditure Reporting Survey: A. Pollard discussed the importance of each school district site completing this survey by May 22, 2015.

Action Item [All]: Deadline is May 22.

Professional Development Survey Results: Survey results were presented to the consortium on the projection system. It was agreed by the consortium that end business day on May 20, 2015 the survey would close to allow a bit more time for more teacher input.

Action Item [P. Mendez]: Close out the survey on Wednesday, May 20, 2015 and send out the results.

AB86 Work Group Updates:

ABE/ASE: E. Anderson discussed the value of CALPRO to conduct Common Core training focused on adult education and career standards in July 2015.

Action Item [E Anderson]: To plan, coordinate and promote details on training via consortium

English as a Second Language: I. Rumayor discussed also bringing in CALPRO to conduct differentiated instruction training for ESL teachers.

Action Item [I Rumayor]: To plan, coordinate and promote details on training via consortium

CTE/Apprenticeship: P Mendez discussed organizing a series of table talk meetings for CTE instructors and ASE Instructors to come together to discuss and work on transition efforts (i.e. articulation, college application days, college classes at ASE sites) that would enhance the ability of ASE graduating students to enroll in CTE programs in community colleges.

Action Item [P. Mendez]: To plan, coordinate and promote details for the table talk for an early fall planning meeting.

Disability Services: K Williams had some suggestions for person to provide valuable disability services training to teachers. Karen will be working with Marcos Huerta on further developing this concept.

Communication & Education: (1) R Serrato reminded members of the consortium that if they have specific groups that they would like to receive an AB86 information presentation to please connect with him. A Pollard reported that Learning Quest gave a wonderful tour and presentation on AB86 to an audience of approximately 50 individuals. (2) R Serrato updated the group on the video production for outreach on the programs our community provides. Again, to be used for information to the community. Before the close of this fiscal year: Ceres Unified, Stanislaus County Office of Education and Modesto Junior College will provide video cuts. The video production will be expanded to add additional school site cuts for other groups interested in being part of the outreach video.
