

ENGLISH AAT Coursework Roadmap

Instructions:

Be sure to see a counselor to make sure that your choices work for all of your intended transfer institutions.

1. Take ENGL 100 or 101 (as per self-placement)¹
2. Take COLSK 100 & GUIDE 111.
3. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: C1 / IGETC 3A.
4. Take COMM 100 or 102.²
5. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: D / IGETC 4.³
6. Take ENGL 102 or 103.
7. Take ENGL 135 or 136 or 137 or 138.⁴
8. Take MATH 101 (may need MATH 32).
9. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: B1 or B2 / IGETC: 5A or 5B.

³ If you are planning to transfer to Stan State to get your degree to teach English in junior high or high school (SSMP degree), you might consider taking COMM 103 Interpersonal Communication, COMM 130 Intercultural Communication, CLDDV 103 Child Growth and Development, CLDDV 262 Diversity in Educational Settings

⁴ Though not required, it is recommended that you complete English 100 or 101 prior to enrolling in Literature classes. If you are planning to transfer to CSU Stanislaus' English Department, take one early period and one late period class from this list in order to meet their local English major requirements. You are advised to see a counselor and do your own research because English major requirements at four-year schools vary; if you know where you hope to transfer, you should take MJC classes that fit that institution's requirements.

12. Take ENGL 135 or 136 or 137 or 138.⁴
13. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: D / IGETC 4.
14. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: B1 or B2 / IGETC: 5A or 5B. If you did not complete the laboratory requirement in step 9 choose a course with lab,
15. Pick a class from list A, B, or C of English A.A.T.
16. Pick a class from list A, B, or C of English A.A.T.
17. Pick one course from the list of General Education Options - CSU GE: D / IGETC 4.
18. If you did not take COLSK 100 take a CSU GE: E course if you might attend a CSU, or choose an elective numbered between 100-299.⁵ .
19. If you have not taken at least two years of foreign language in high school and plan to transfer to a UC take an IGETC: Area 6A language course, or if you have not reached 60 units take any elective course numbered between 100-299.⁵
20. If you have not reached 60 transferable units choose an elective numbered between 100-299.⁵
